### **Building Condition Audit for Canadian Government Conference Centre**

The Canadian Government Conference Centre was originally constructed in 1909-1912 as Ottawa's Union Station. This designated heritage building consists of approximately 12,500 m<sup>2</sup> of floor area. The building's present use consists of offices, conference facilities and storage. Planned future uses include leasing a significant portion of the building to the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame.



### **South Edmonton Transit Facility**

The South Edmonton Transit Facility is a newly designed facility that will house all necessary activities for the operation and maintenance of a fleet of 250 transit buses. It is a massive single storey industrial occupancy with a total area of approximately 25 000 m<sup>2</sup>, designed to achieve LEED<sup>®</sup> Silver Level certification from the Canadian Green Building Council (CaGBC). We brought superior integration skills to the multi-disciplinary team including architectural, structural, mechanical, electrical and civil engineering, to meet a demanding budget and schedule for the opening of the facility on time.
